David T. Chase Scholarship

2024-2025 Award Guidelines and Criteria

The Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools (FACS) announces the availability of new David T. Chase Scholarships for the 2024-2025 academic year.

1. The Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools will award one **renewable** scholarship in the amount of **\$1,500.00** from the David T. Chase Scholarship Fund, to **a student entering or attending** East Catholic High School **OR** Northwest Catholic High School **OR** St. Paul Catholic High School. **A single** award will be made at one of the high schools.
2. The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of **financial need, entrepreneurial spirit and academic promise**. The Distribution Committee may also wish to consider the student's commitment to volunteer service that benefits the community. This Scholarship is open to students of **all faiths**.
3. Interested candidates/families (students currently in 8th grade at **any school, public or private**) should complete the Scholarship Application Form and submit it with all supporting documentation to the 8th grade Principal.
4. The student's 8th grade Principal is to complete the Principal Certification section of the Application (Page 4) and attest the application is complete. The application must be forwarded with all supporting documentation to the Archdiocesan High School by **March 4, 2024**, the due date established by the High School for review and submission to FACS.
5. **A copy of the student's most recent report card must be included with the application documentation.**
6. The High School Admissions Office is responsible for submitting the completed Scholarship Applications, with all supporting documentation, to the Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools.

Renewable awards are conditional upon the Archdiocesan High School providing documentation to FACS each year which verifies that the student remains enrolled, is in good academic standing and has continued financial need.
