Dear families,

In preparation for the upcoming school year, we want to provide you with updated information regarding our school uniform. All changes will also be reflected in the Student Handbook that will be published later this summer and located in your FACTS portal.

The Class of 2027 will be grandfathered in with regards to the student uniform. This means that the senior class will be able to wear uniforms previously purchased from Land's End, Dennis, and/or Tommy Hilfiger.

The remaining classes must purchase their school uniform through our uniform partner, Tommy Hilfiger, with the exception of school pants. Students may continue to purchase pants at a store of their choosing as long as they are khaki color, are not form fitting, and do not have patch pockets or metal rivets.

Shoes can be brown or black leather dress shoes. Other options include solid color brown, black, gray, and white boat shoes and sneakers, low top only. Laces and logos must be monochromatic. Sandals, slippers, flip flops, work boots, or athletic slides are not permitted.

Any ongoing medical issues that require medical notes for exemption from school uniform policies must be renewed at the beginning of each school year. A copy of such a note should be forwarded to the school nurse, as well the Principal.

Our student uniform policy is designed to promote a professional, respectful, and modest appearance that reflects the values of our school community. Skorts should be worn at an appropriate length that allows students to participate comfortably in all school activities, while maintaining a neat and modest appearance. **Female students choosing to wear a skort as part of their daily uniform are required to wear a skort that reaches their mid thigh.** If a female student does not meet this requirement, they will only be permitted to wear pants to school. **In addition, female students will be required to wear tights that are a solid color navy, white, or black after Columbus Day until April vacation.**

This adjustment to the student uniform policy is intended to create greater consistency across our dress code by more accurately reflecting the existing expectations for male students' uniform shorts in relation to the season and/or weather. By aligning standards for all students, we aim to ensure fairness, promote a professional and modest appearance, and maintain a consistent approach to school attire throughout our student body.
