This morning, Governor Lamont ordered the cancellation of inschool classes for the remainder of the 2019-2020 academic year. Therefore, there will not be a 2020 CIAC spring sports season. While certainly not what you anticipated, we will recognize and are planning an alternative "Senior Night" experience for each spring team (for Senior student-athletes only) consistent with social distancing and limited assembly guidelines. We will communicate specifics once plans become finalized. In the meantime, continue to be leaders in the "classroom."
