Archbishop's Scholarship

Guidelines and Criteria for 2020-2021 Grants

The Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools (FACS) invites applications for the Archbishop's Scholarship for the 2020-2021 Academic Year.

1. The Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools will award a total of **4 renewable** scholarships each in the amount of **\$1,250** in the name of the Archbishop of Hartford to **students in any grade** the one of the Archdiocesan High Schools: East Catholic High School, Northwest Catholic High School, St. Paul Catholic High School and/or Sacred Heart High School. Each High School shall receive one award.
2. The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of **financial need** and **academic excellence** to residents of communities served by the Archdiocese of Hartford.
3. Interested candidates/families should complete the Scholarship Application Form and forward it, with all supporting documentation, to the school Finance Office by **Tuesday, February 2, 2021**, so that the President/Chief Administrator will have time to complete the Principal Certification.
4. The Principal/President is to complete the Principal Certification section (Application Page 4) and attest the application is complete. Then the application with all supporting documentation must be forwarded to the Archdiocesan High School by the due date established by the High School Principal for review and submission to FACS.
5. A copy of the student's most recent report card must be included with the application.
6. The High School Admissions Office is responsible for submitting the completed Scholarship Applications, with supporting documentation, to the Foundation for the Advancement of Catholic Schools **on or before Friday, February 5, 2021.**

APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED AFTER THE DUE DATE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

Renewable awards are conditional upon the Archdiocesan High School providing documentation to FACS each year which verifies that the student remains enrolled, is in good academic standing and has continued financial need.
