THE COMMUNITY

St. Paul Catholic High School is a vibrant, faith-based, college preparatory, learning community that fosters a culture of integrity, courage, and character. Since its establishment in 1966 by the Archdiocese of Hartford, St. Paul Catholic High School has educated, nurtured, and prepared nearly 7,000 students to meet the challenges of college and their career options.

The renovated school building sits on 27 acres in northeast Bristol. The facilities include classrooms with state-of-the-art equipment and a library/media center; computer and science laboratories, featuring a computer-aided design lab; a performing arts program with an auditorium, fine arts room, music room, and a computer-based piano/guitar instruction lab; a television studio and world language lab; gymnasium, fitness center, and athletic fields; and a dining hall, school store, chapel, guidance and administrative offices.

Admission to the ninth grade is based on prior achievement, teacher letters of recommendation, and the STS High School Placement Examination. Transfer students are admitted to the upper grades based on current high school academic performance.

PROMOTION AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The State of Connecticut, the Archdiocese of Hartford, and St. Paul Catholic High School have established the following credit distribution for graduation purposes:

In order to be promoted with his/her class, a student must have acquired the following number of credits:

- 6 Credits required for promotion to sophomore year
- 13 Credits required for promotion to junior year
- 20 Credits required for promotion to senior year
- 27 Credits required for graduation

GRADES

The semester grading system includes four grading periods per year, in addition to mid-term and final exams, with grades recorded at the end of each quarter. Quarter and final grades appear on an official transcript.

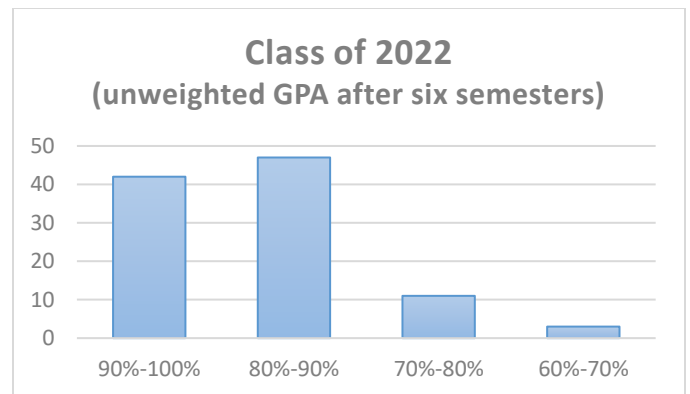
HONOR ROLL

CLASS RANK

A weighted system of grading is used in calculating the class rank. Since courses differ in their level of academic challenge, the weighted class rank provides a more accurate representation of a student's academic achievement. It is used only for class rank purposes. Courses have been assigned one of the following levels:

AP/ECE	Advanced Placement & UCONN Early College Experience courses involve the highest degree of selectivity and rigor.	factor 1.10
HON	Honors courses involve a higher degree of selectivity, speed, and difficulty of material.	factor 1.05
CP I	The College Preparatory I courses have an average level of rigor and selectivity.	factor 1.0
CP II	The College Preparatory II courses emphasize basic academic skills	factor 0.95
